Well, it's official! Support4Recovery is 15 years old!

During our 15 years, we have awarded 19 dental grants; 9 Support4Families grants; 52 Alumni Outreach grants; 112 Support4Education grants; and 1,270 Support4Housing grants. And that is without counting all the advocacy we have undertaken within Contra Costa County.

On June 25, 2022, we held the **Support4Recovery 15th Anniversary Celebration and Recovery Fair** at the Martinez Marina. A recap of that celebration can be found in the following section.

We are proud to report that Support4Recovery was awarded a **Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition** by Congressman Mark DeSaulnier, who represents California's 11th Congressional District (the majority of Contra Costa County). He serves unselfishly - devoted to supporting individuals and families in recovery.

PROJECT REPORTS

<u>Support4Housing</u> – Our housing program is currently funded by the John Muir Health Fund and private donations. We are now focused mainly on providing safe housing for members of the community who do not otherwise qualify under the County's grant program. As of June 30, we have funded 19 grants for individuals, who would otherwise be left out of the system, giving those people a much better shot at recovery.

<u>Support4Families</u> – Support4Families is planning a program to provide scholarships for back-to-school clothing for families in recovery. Families who qualify would receive a grant to buy school essentials – clothing and backpacks – through a designated local retailer. We plan to work closely with the various alumni associations for referrals, both to support those associations, as well as to encourage people to stay involved after treatment.

<u>Needs Survey</u> – We are close to shutting down the needs survey and assessing what the community is asking for. We expect to develop our 2022-2023 programs with the findings. If you have not yet completed the survey, and are in recovery, please use the survey link here.

<u>Hispanic Community</u> – Our efforts to reach the Spanish-speaking recovery community continue. We have completed the majority of the filming and are now assembling a powerful video, documenting the stories of members of the Hispanic community – individuals in recovery as well as their families. We previewed a trailer at the 15th Anniversary Celebration! We aim to increase awareness of, and participation in, Spanishlanguage addiction treatment.

<u>Alumni Association Support</u> – Over the past few months, we have supported a variety of alumni activities, including establishing an alumni association at Pueblos del Sol, in Concord. On June 12, 2022, we hosted an amazing gathering of Wollam and Oz alumni and community members. On July 31, we will support alumni fundraisers at Diablo Valley Ranch and Discovery House.
